Job Title: Advanced Practice Provider (PA)

A collaborating physician/nurse practitioner prescriptive agreement is required for the first year of full-time practice for new graduate PA-C.

**Overtime Status:** Exempt

<u>Position Purpose:</u> An exempt position responsible for providing general surgery services, including completing history and physical examinations, conducting consultation appointments, assessing, diagnosing, ordering and interpreting laboratory tests, prescribing, treating, assisting in the operating room, and educating patients to provide quality holistic inpatient and outpatient surgical care. Must be able to perform the professional, clinical, and technical competencies in the surgical department. Works independently and in collaboration with physicians, advanced practice providers, and clinical and administrative support staff in a teambased approach to patient care.

<u>Description of work week:</u> No holidays or weekend coverage required. 40-50 hours per work week. Monday through Friday, hours may flex based on clinic/OR/hospital rounding for the week.

#### **Job Responsibilities and Accountabilities**:

- Assist in OR, round on hospitalized patients, and perform new consultations.
- Perform unaided minor procedures, including removal of drains, staples, sutures, debridement, and complex wound management.
- Collaborate and communicate with referring provider, patient's family, and surgeon regarding patient care plan, including the discharge planning process.
- Assist in management of post-operative and critically ill patients.
- Complete clinically appropriate, concise, timely documentation of visits in patient chart, including consultations, history and physicals, progress notes, and discharge summary.
- Conduct preoperative planning and optimization in outpatient and inpatient settings.
- Actively involve patient in postoperative and discharge planning.
- Provide culturally and linguistically appropriate education and counseling to patients and their families/caregivers.

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- Order and coordinate home care, hospice, transitional care or long-term facility care, and patient transfers to other health care facilities as appropriate.
- Deliver outpatient preoperative and postoperative follow-up care in clinic setting.
- Conduct preoperative optimization appointments to assess patient readiness for surgery and care planning for optimal surgical outcomes.
- Initiate care plans for patients and provide goal-oriented management of comorbid conditions to reduce hospital stay, readmissions, and postoperative complications.
- Place special focus on the geriatric patient population, patients undergoing major abdominal operations, or surgery involving an anastomosis.
- Conduct outpatient wound care assessment and treatment plan.

### Continuous quality improvement in the delivery of general medical/surgical care

- Strive to provide quality, cost-effective, patient-centered care.
- Coordinate and enhance care between pre-hospital, hospital, and post-hospital care through the collaboration of facilities and providers.
- Improve communication and collaboration between primary care providers in collaborative groups, including GI specialists, breast cancer treatment groups, oncology groups, and hospital staff.
- Participate in patient case review opportunities and Quality Assurance, Process Improvement meetings.
- Participate in activities that contribute to the education of other healthcare professionals including presentations, publishing, and ongoing education of other healthcare professionals.
- Advance practice through continual education opportunities and updated evidencebased practice guidelines.

#### **Compliance:**

- Recognize and comply with legal regulatory, accrediting, and procedural requirements related to area of responsibility
- Protect patient and team member privacy and only access patient and/or team memberrelated information as needed to perform job duties
- Report violations or areas of concern to supervisor or Corporate Compliance Officer via established methods of communication

- Perform efficient time management to achieve expected productivity.
- Maintain patient and organizational confidentiality.
- Provide detail-oriented, safe, evidence-based patient care.


**<u>Credentialing:</u>** Expenses that are covered include License, DEA, and hospital facility fees.
